
We will hold an open Swiss Teams game Thursday evening 11/30 at 6:00.

More on the New Laws

Claims and Concessions.

There are two changes in the Claim/Concession laws.

The player making a claim or concession now is required to face their hand. Previously this was optional, unless the director required it in order to rule on the claim. The player making the claim or concession still “should” make a clear statement of their line of play. Failure to make such a statement can result in the director ruling based on a less successful line of play than you intended.

The non-claiming/conceding side may now request “play it out.” If all four players agree (including dummy) play continues, the claim/concession is ignored, and there is no requirement to follow any stated “line of play”. Any information disclosed in the claim or the request to play it out is authorized to all players. The director will not rule in any way on the (voided) claim/concession.

Why would you do this? I honestly don’t see any advantage, but I know it happens sometimes, particularly in limited games. The lawbook is simply making that common practice no longer an irregularity.

Penalty Cards

In the past a penalty card was unauthorized information to partner, but the fact that it must be played was authorized.

Now, a penalty card is authorized information for all players at the table while it is face up. If it is returned to the player’s hand it becomes unauthorized information to their partner (but still authorized for declarer). If the penalty card is played the fact that it has been played is authorized to everyone, but the circumstances under which it became a penalty card are unauthorized to the partner.
