Charity Games

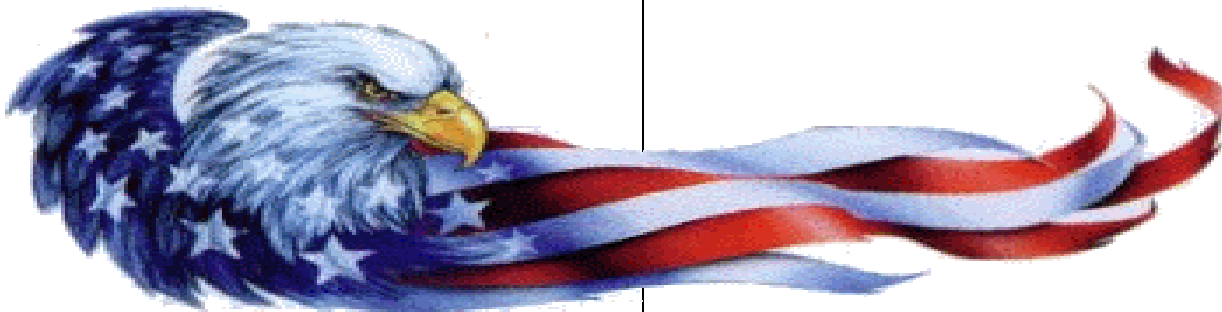
We will have two days of charity games in July, on Friday the 7th at and Tuesday the 25th.

Making Life Master

To review the requirement for Life Master:

500 masterpoints are required, including
At least 75 are black
At least 75 are silver
At least 100 are red/gold/platinum, of which 50 or more are gold/platinum.

You earn black points at local club games and online; silver points are awarded at sectional tournaments and in clubs during silver point weeks.

To get red and gold points, you must attend regional and/or national tournaments and compete in the open events. Note that regional tournaments often have games for 0-750 with gold points awarded for those who place high. Platinum points are given to those who compete at the very highest level in national tournaments.

You should sign in to the ACBL website. When you look up your points on the website, there's a helpful feature, MY NEXT RANK REQUIREMENTS, that will tell you specifically what is yet needed.

Note: The above is for those who joined the ACBL after 1/01/2010. If you joined earlier, your requirements are lower.
